Michael Bush, Artistic Director Cabaret & Performance Conference

Michael Bush most recently directed the Off-Broadway revival of Cactus Flower and Leslie Uggams' Uptown Downtown at the Pasadena Playhouse, which won the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle Award for best solo performance. He won the 2009 New York Musical Theatre Festival Award for Excellence in Direction for the world premiere musical *Hurricane* produced in the 2009 New York Musical Theatre Festival. He is the former director of artistic production for the Manhattan Theatre Club in New York City. He was associated with MTC for over 25 years and helped artistically guide more than 150 new plays and musicals, including the Tony Award and Pulitzer Prize-winning *Proof, Doubt,* the Tony Award winning *Love! Valour! Compassion!, A Class Act* (Tony Nomination for Best Musical) and Andrew Lippa's *The Wild Party.* At MTC he most recently directed Based on a Totally True Story. He was instrumental in the rebirth of the Eugene O'Neill Theater Center's Cabaret & Performance Conference, and has served as its Artistic Director since 2005. Under his guidance the Conference has developed over 60 new shows, revues, and intimate musicals including [*title of show*] and *The Story of My Life*, both of which were produced on Broadway.

Mr. Bush directed Stormy Weather for the Pasadena Playhouse in Los Angeles and Murderers for The Philadelphia Theatre Company, City Theatre in Pittsburgh, and the Emelin Theatre in New York, and the musicals Pure Heaven: a Party with Kay Thompson at the Emelin, and The Story of My Life at Toronto's CanStage. He also directed Stormy Weather for The Prince Music Theatre in Philadelphia. Mr. Bush directed the New York Music Theater Festival (NYMF) productions of The Ballad of Bonnie and Clyde (2005), and Grammy Award-winning songwriter Marcus Hummon's musicals Warrior (2006), and The Piper (2007). For the 2008 NYMF Festival he directed the Richard Rodgers Award winner musical To Paint the Earth. During his tenure as producing artistic director at Charlotte Repertory Theatre in Charlotte NC (2002-2004) he presented Hilary Swank in The Miracle Worker, Penny Fuller in The Glass Menagerie, and directed the 20th Anniversary production of Pump Boys and Dinettes. He also directed and co-wrote the book for the musical Let Me Sing which was co-produced with George Street Playhouse in New Jersey and Charlotte Repertory Theatre. He is currently the artistic director of Fidelity FutureStage in New York City; an education program that teaches playwriting to high school and middle school students and he directs their annual Broadway Finale event each spring.

From the Artistic Director

SING FOR YOUR SUPPER "Sing and you'll be fed"

Every year I look to the great American Songbook to find a song to use as the theme of our conference. This year I turned to Rodgers and Hart's wonderful Sing For Your Supper. This song was originally written for their musical The Boys From Syracuse in 1938 during the height of the great depression, a time that unfortunately mirrors our own. But the song is a celebration of the human spirit and expresses an optimism that was and hopefully still is a part of the American dream. Its message of *"sing and you'll be fed"* refers not only to the artist's need for work, but it is also a metaphor for a greater need...the need to feed our souls.



I have always felt that music is the highest expression of human emotion, and here at the Cabaret & Performance Conference we use music and song to define ourselves. And that is what the art of "performance" is all about. We use songs to tell our own very personal stories and to express the truth of who we are.

So this year we are celebrating the art of performance. And we have some of the best performers in the business coming to sing for their supper. During this year's conference we will be presenting Broadway legends **Jim Dale**, **Lilias White**, **Penny Fuller**, and the extraordinary composer/songstress **Amanda McBroom**, in solo evenings that celebrate their own personal life stories thru the power of their songs. We will also be presenting our second annual **O'Neill Follies**, a two act powerhouse evening on Sunday, Aug.7th that includes a dinner break where you can pre-order a picnic dinner and dine on the beautiful grounds of the O'Neill Theatre Center. This evening promises to be one of the highlights of the conference and will feature **Joel Silberman**, **Euan Morton**, **Allan Harris**, **Amanda McBroom**, and a very special appearance by the one and only **Lillian Montevecchi**.

Our Fellows program continues to grow with our **2011 Fellows Cabaret Evenings** on Saturday August 6th and Thursday August 11th. And our **Junior Fellows**, this year including local talent from southeast Connecticut, take the stage for their own concert on Friday Aug. 12th. We will also be working on two new small musicals that have their roots in Cabaret Theatre. **Cross That River** by Allan and Pat Harris and Michael Aman, a musical about black cowboys that began life here at the conference three years ago and will be fully produced in the summer of 2012 by the Aspen Theatre Festival in Aspen, Colorado. And a brand new piece called **40 Naked Women, a Monkey and Me** by Jonathan Brielle that is just about the best title I have ever come across.

Of course, most nights include our infamous open mic sessions hosted by yours truly and where we will again take no prisoners...so fasten your seat belts. And we end it all on Saturday August 13th with our **Grand Finale Cabaret** that has happily become one of the hot tickets of the summer. So check our calendar and make your plans now....come join us as we sing for our supper. It promises to be a smorgasbord.

Cabaret & Performance Conference August 3 - 14, 2011



The Cabaret & Performance Conference was re-established in 2005 after a six year hiatus as a dynamic opportunity for performers to work on new projects with the guidance of an accomplished team of professional directors, music directors, and guest artists. The Conference reexamines, redefines and revitalizes the Cabaret art form for the 21st century using a definition of cabaret as "any kind of live performance in an intimate space that breaks the fourth wall." During its intense two-week period, this conference provides hands-on artistic guidance and instruction to a select group of participants chosen by application and invitation, as well as the development of special "Cabaret Theater" projects featuring some of the top names in theatre today.

The O'Neill provides a professional faculty (led by Artistic Director Michael Bush, Associate Artistic Director Joel Silberman, and Artistic Associates Penny Fuller, Barry Kleinbort, and Donna Trinkoff) and the resources to support the creation of new cabaret/ theater performance pieces. The conference offers its artists individualized attention and the opportunity to interact with other artists who are developing new work, establishing support and camaraderie between participants, guest artists, and faculty.

The Fellows program is a select group of individuals who are provided with an intense course of study under the direction of Barry Kleinbort and Penny Fuller and the support of four music directors. With two classes daily, the Fellows prepare for three public performances during the conference, but are also encouraged to experiment and sing nightly at the conference's open mic sessions. In 2010 the Conference added a similar Junior Fellows Program for young people in their teens.

Over the last six summers, the Conference has presented over 60 performances including Broadway favorites Leslie Uggams, Brent Barrett, Gregg Edelman, Tony Roberts, Penny Fuller, Gretha Boston, Anita Gillete, Rita Gardner and recording artists such as Rock and Roll Hall of Fame's Ronnie Spector, Grammy Award winner Marcus Hummon, and country recording artist Sherrie Austin. The Conference has also developed intimate musicals including [*title* of *show*] and *The Story of My Life*, both of which were produced on Broadway.
